

## CHRISTMAS LIGHTS 2021

The Christmas Lights Contract for 2021–2023 was put out to tender in March 2021 and awarded to Lite Ltd.

Having declared a Climate Change Emergency in 2019 the environmental impact of the lights was an important factor. Timing devices were fitted to the power connections to control the operational hours of the lighting, reducing energy usage. All the lights are LED. The Lights on the Town Hall will also be fitted with a timer for Christmas 2022.

## PARK ROAD PLAY AREA UPDATE



A £30,000 makeover project to give Park Road play area a long-awaited new lease of life has seen some new additions to the activity play provision.

The park, which opened in the autumn, already features bright and colourful equipment designed to stimulate imaginative and active play and appeal to toddlers and young children.

The inclusion of three new painted street games on an old area of concrete completes the revamp.

# NEW PEDESTRIAN ACCESS FOR TOWER HILL CEMETERY



Work is continuing at Tower Hill Cemetery where an additional pedestrian entrance will be created, following an audit on disability access by experts last year. To make the cemetery as accessible as possible, the new entrance will be located in the wall that runs along the northern end of the cemetery.

## SERVICE FOCUS - YOUTH GRANTS

Since launching in August 2020 Witney Town Council's £30,000, Youth Grants pot continues to be seen as a vital source of funding. <u>Discover more about the funding and how to apply</u>.

Here is how this year's funding has been allocated:

Got2B Community Interest Company was awarded £18,693 towards a second detached/in house youth session, following need demonstrated last year.

Home Start Oxford received £9,318 to improve their befriending services in Witney – supporting babies and preschool children and their parents, through a range of groups.

Oxfordshire Music and Arts have been awarded £7,668 for a six month program of tutorial sessions and band camp experiences aiming to culminate in a Youth Festival. The sessions are available to youths who are under privileged, excluded or vulnerable.

**Synolos** has been granted £4,068 for quality resources to kit out their Step 2 Safe Space which will provide stimulating and rewarding activities for young Autistic people.











## SERVICE FOCUS - COMMUNITY GRANTS

Witney Town Council awards discretionary grants to local community organisations working within the town to assist them with what they do, help fund the purchase of new equipment or help with a particular event or activity. It also considers discretionary subsidised hire requests for the letting of its venues.

### Grants awarded in 2021/22 are as follows:

£994.31 – 2120 (Witney) Squadron R.A.F Air Cadets towards life-saving equipment

£500.00 – Rotary Club of Witney towards Witney Colour Run

£385.00 – Witney Parkrun towards a portable defibrillator

£2310.00 – Witney Day Centre towards a community Men's shed project

£2079.00 – Witney Mills Cricket Club towards a new pitch lawnmower

£500.00 - Witney Town Band

The shed is currently under construction at Ceewood Hall and will provide a place which nurtures social connections and friendship, the sharing of knowledge and skills or just conversation and companionship.



## WITNEY - A FAIRTRADE TOWN

It's no surprise that a town like Witney should be a Fairtrade Town – but what is it and what does being a Fair Trade Town mean? Wendy from the Witney Area Fair Trade Action Group(WAFTAG)sent us an article all about Fair Trade, with an appeal for help to continue with the group's aims.

In 2006, a small, but passionate group of individuals in Witney launched WAFTAG. There was much support for Fairtrade in shops and businesses and among the population, and after much hard work and awareness raising the group managed to gain the necessary council support.

A suitable resolution was passed and in June 2011 Witney proudly celebrated becoming the 1000th Fairtrade town in the world!

Today Witney has a range of Fair Trade goods widely available across the town. Local people recognise the Fairtrade Mark and understand that it guarantees that the goods they buy with that mark have come from producers who get a fairer share of the money paid for them. It helps us be mindful of the origins of much of our food, something that we can easily lose sight of with, today's easily available, conveniently packaged supermarket foods.



Witney's Fairtrade group has been an active one that has been fundamental in raising awareness of the fight for trade and social justice in the town and changing public attitudes.

You may have come across one of their events or seen them taking part in the In Bloom planting with their containers on the Leys complete with bee boxes and sustainable planting schemes.

Members of WAFTAG still have the same passion for the movement that they have always had but they are a smallish group and are looking to recruit some additional members and would love to hear from some energetic new supporters. If you can prepare and make a contingency plan and know what to do and who to contact, it makes it much easier to deal with an emergency effectively.



For Children's Mental Health Week 2022, we will be encouraging children (and adults) to consider how they have grown and how they can help others to grow. I in 6 children and young people have a diagnosable mental health problem, and many more struggle with challenges from bullying to bereavement.
